Come and take a look around Hyson Green. There are many hidden treasures that you won't believe exist. You'll be amazed by the range and quality of artwork. All you need is this leaflet and you'll be able to guide yourself around this local area and not miss out on any of the wonders of Nottingham.

One of the most stunning things you will see in Hyson Green, which was created by artists from Nottingham, is a black history mural. Inspired by people who fought for black people rights, including George Africanus (who is a Nottingham legend and a former slave), it took four months to complete the project. Launched in 2016, this inspirational piece of art is a brilliant place to start your art adventure.

Just up the road from the black history mural, there's even more fantastic graffiti to be seen, on the side of a house next to Hyson Green's skate park. This fabulous piece of art work is a must see. Again this is another tribute to a black history The Think Global act local piece, which is created by Mimm, is a few years old but still a lush green spring that looks best glimmering in the sunshine and blue skies.

As you return to the centre of Hyson Green, you will see a magnificent sculpture on a fence, including the faces of people who live in the local area. This heart-warming piece really bring the community together and is a must see on your travels.

There are also inside attractions that you can visit, such as the NAE (New Art Exchange) and Mary potter studio. Inside you can see a number of pieces of great artwork, created by local artists and by artists further afield. The NAE puts on various exhibitions in their galleries. As well as amazing artwork, the staff are very friendly and there is a lovely café where you can stop and reflect on what you have seen. So what are you waiting for?
